

Living into the Spirit

Pentecost has arrived! We remember this every year. In Fr. Nick's Pentecost sermon, he stated this is the second most important day in the church year following Easter. That places this event even in front of Christmas!

This blessing of the Holy Spirit can help guide us in every decision, every thought, and every prayer. I don't know about you, but I sometimes struggle with leaning into the Spirit for guidance. This requires time to develop the relationship with the Spirit and help it reckon with our will. Remember: it is God who calls and the Holy Spirit who moves our hearts.

The Holy Spirit helps us live into true freedom. Free, in the first place, <u>from</u> selfishness, from pride and the desire to stand out. Remember this spirit of freedom doesn't mean we can follow our own impulses as though everything that doesn't come from ourselves were an imposition we had to free ourselves from. Rather, it means acting with the same Spirit as Jesus: "I have come down from heaven, not to do my own will, but the will of him who sent me" (*John 6:38*). This freedom allows us to lean <u>into</u> all our talents, initiative, and creativity with God's help.

Living with freedom of spirit means letting the Holy Spirit be the one who shapes and guides us, and who also makes use of those God has placed at our side to help us. John 3:8 tells us:

"The wind blows wherever it pleases. You hear its sound, but you cannot tell where it comes from or where it is going. So it is with everyone born of the Spirit."



The times have changed. We are moving into a new era. Pastor Aaron is starting. I am transitioning out of the youth and young adult position. We are in this together. Let us continue to be flexible and forgiving, allowing the Spirit to blow us in a new direction.

Please continue to drop off items in the bins in the back of the church or in the Parish Hall entryway.


