

I made a visit to my loc al craft store last night to find that everything has tu rned into pum pkins, I eaves, and Halloween!

It's a stark reminder that, even with some 90 -degree days likely ahead of us, fall is right around the corner. As we move into fall and parish activities pick up, I'd like to highlight a few things concerning our common life together as a community.

Common Cup -

I'm grateful to everyone who provided feedback concerning distribution of wine at communion. After prayerful deliberation, I've discerned that we will continue our current practice, with one modification. From a theologimodeling the inclusivity and commitment to safety and health that Jesus models for us in the Gospels. We have a very high proportion of parishioners who cannot tolerate gluten. Some of them have commented that our current practice allows them to consume the wine wafers contaminates the cup for them.
